







The Ministry of National Security is using five key pillars to tackle the issue of crime and violence in Jamaica. These are reflected in a strategy for preventing crime based on social development, situational prevention, effective policing, swift and sure justice processes and reducing reoffending. Over the past year, the Ministry has made strides under each pillar.

## PILLAR 1 – Swift and Sure Justice Processe

# Pillar 5 – Effective Policing



- Get the Guns campaign resulted in over 773 guns seized between January and November 2017
- 80 pre-owned cars and 16 pickups acquired to boost mobility
- 25 SUVs acquired for Jamaica Constabulary Force (JCF) Divisional and Area Supervisors
- 114 cars repaired under Operation Quick Fix
- More vehicular check points
- Two ships patrolling areas of the coastline
- King Air aircraft to be handed over in 2018 to boost border security
- 17 police stations and two dormitories repaired
- Parish Consultative Committees restarted
- Retired police officers and private security guards employed
- 31 dogs acquired (24 from Colombia, 7 from the United States of America
- Increased JCF and JDF recruitment drives
